



Judith Wright 1915-2000


What is Wright doing in *Nigger's Leap: New England* (1945)?

- Aboriginal Charter of Rights (1962)
- What is this poem saying about Aboriginal experience?
- How does Oodgeroo's use of language differ from Wright's?
- What purposes can poetry serve?

- What is this poem about?
- What's the tone of the poem and how does Oodgeroo convey this tone?
- What happens when the poem moves from "they" to "we"?
- What is implied by the title / last line?
